Our goal is to help healthcare providers deliver direct healthcare and healthcare education to underserved communities by matching their skills and desire for making a difference to high quality medical missions. We also support the passions of CHG Healthcare employees by giving back to the communities where they live and work.

## HOW WE ACHIEVE OUR MISSION

### MEDICAL MISSION OPPORTUNITIES

We partner with world-class nonprofits to offer medical mission opportunities to healthcare providers. Missions often help providers reconnect with their passion for practicing medicine and bring their services to people and places in need.

### INDIVIDUAL PROVIDER GRANTS

Each year we provide grants to healthcare providers who have found their perfect mission but just need financial support to offset mission program costs.

### SUSTAINABLE HEALTHCARE GRANTS

We provide multi-year healthcare grants to nonprofit organizations that deliver direct healthcare services or healthcare education to underserved communities in the areas where CHG Healthcare offices are located.

### LOCAL GRANTS

We provide grants to local organizations whose missions match the passions of CHG employees. Causes that matter most to them receive an extra boost from us.

### DISASTER RELIEF GRANTS

In times of crisis we want to pitch in to help communities that are hurting through disaster relief grants. These small grants allow us to show we care about the communities where CHG employees live.

All of us all can positively impact our communities and the lives of others through small acts of kindness, support, and the love we give each day. The mission of the Making a Difference Foundation is to help ignite and support this passion of giving back to health-care providers and the employees of CHG Healthcare. We had the opportunity to help **80 healthcare providers** go on medical missions in **18 different locations** around the world. These providers treated an estimated **15,000 men, women, and children** in underserved communities. We have included stories from two of our providers, Randy Archibald, PA and Keith Linford, OD, sharing their life changing experiences on their medical missions. **Our goal in 2020 is to support over 110 providers** to find their passion in medical missions.

Within the local communities where CHG employees live and work, we provided almost **\$315,000 in grants** to support nonprofit organizations that CHG employees are passionate about and actively involved in. I am always highly impressed and amazed at how much CHG employees work to change the lives of others. Rayna tells us her story of how it feels to make positive change in her local community.

We were also delighted to provide a matching grant to the CHG Employee Compassion Fund (ECF) in 2019. The ECF provides grants to CHG employees who are facing financial hardships due to a variety of circumstances including illness, natural disaster, or dealing with the death of a family member. The contributions come directly from CHG employees who are giving small donations from their paycheck to make a positive change for another employee. The story from Amanda, shows that this fund is a true example of how small acts of support can make a big difference to individuals in their time of need.

I am incredibly appreciative of everyone who has provided their time, resources, energy, and expertise to the foundation. Thank you to everyone who donated to support our meaningful work. # REIGNITING THE FLAME THROUGH MEDICAL MISSIONS

Medical missions can reignite a passion for practicing medicine. When your job centers around helping people, it can be easy to feel drained or burned out. It's rewarding for us at the foundation when we see the medical providers on a medical mission trip find that spark that drew them into this profession in the first place. Providers are able to sit down and talk with patients, which they find to be a wonderful change of pace from their practices at home.

For many of the communities we serve, there is limited or no access to medical care. Patients travel long distances just to be seen by an American doctor. Often, they simply want to know that their children are healthy or they need education on how to address chronic issues that they have dealt with for years. Our

providers are able to help in very tangible ways through health education, immunizations, and even providing medications. A little bit goes a long way in making a huge difference for these families and individuals.

In 2017, we began with four medical providers on one medical mission. The following year we were able to connect 19 providers to 4 trips traveling Thailand, Haiti, Guatemala, and Kenya. And in 2019, we are proud to say we were able to provide the opportunity for 74 providers to go on 12 medical mission trips. For us, every provider represents hundreds of patients that were able to receive healthcare. Watching them find passion in helping these communities brings such an amazing sense of fulfillment of our mission.



# RANDY'S STORY

My passion for working in the medical field began when I was a young man on a two-year mission for my church in Chile. During this mission I got pretty sick. In the community where I lived, there wasn't much access to medical care. I was taken to a local woman who gave me herbs and traditional remedies, but it was nothing like I was used to growing up in the states. Something about that experience always stuck with me. We really do have so many opportunities here in the U.S. that people around the world don't have.

Since becoming a Physician Assistant, I've always wanted to go on a medical mission. In the fall of 2019, I traveled to Quetzaltenago, Guatemala and participated in a mission with the Making a Difference Foundation. I loved getting to see how other people live and experiencing their culture. I was amazed at the people I met and how satisfied and happy they were in the midst of really challenging conditions. I also loved other providers and staff I worked with on this trip. Everyone had a good heart, was there for the right reason, and I made some good friends. I also made friends with the homestay family I lived with and experienced what real life is like for them. I am overwhelmed with gratitude for the entire experience.

Before going on the trip, I did some research on tropical diseases—and other more exotic ailments—trying to prepare for what I might encounter. But the reality was, the people I saw needed really basic medical care and education. For example, here in the U.S., if someone has heartburn or indigestion, they know that it's probably acid reflux and they know they can go to the pharmacy and buy something. There were quite a few people I saw in Guatemala that said, "my stomach hurts, I have nausea, I have a bad taste in my mouth, and I have no idea what it is." They may have lived with this for 6 months or a year and didn't have the resources or knowledge to treat it. Most of my time was spent doing very basic education around heart health and basic illnesses, all of which we take for granted.

*Ultimately, I wasn't treating exotic illness, but rather many common issues people have here in the United States.*

I came back feeling that I need to do more volunteer work because sometimes I can get caught up in all the aspects of everyday life. We are all really busy—we have our family responsibilities, and our jobs—and it's easy to forget to take the time to help someone else. Even though I have a job where I like to think I help people every day, it's just different if you take the initiative and find a volunteer opportunity. Giving of myself, without any expectations, is really good for my heart and my outlook on life.

This trip reminded me of that early experience I had in Chile, and just how different things are based on where you live and the access you have to healthcare. And yet, things are very similar—the people I encountered are doing the best they can every day, just like all of us. Seeing how much you can help someone who doesn't have access to medicine and what a difference that can make for them, made me feel good that I chose medicine as a profession. Seeing so many people line up to come to our clinic, and how happy and excited they were just to be seen made me feel hopeful that I am touching people's lives as I go along.

## KEITH'S STORY

Bwindi Community Hospital in Buhoma, Uganda is literally at the end of the road leading to the Impenetrable National Park. It has a tragic history of the expulsion of an indigenous population, the Batwa (pygmies), from their home in the jungle by gorillas who were protected by the government. Driven from their homes at gunpoint, with no assistance or compensation, this community was truly devastated.

Two years ago, The Hope Alliance was the first to provide vision care to this isolated region. There is a tremendous need for reading glasses and education for proper eye hygiene. All household cooking is done over a wood-burning stove and the fields are cleared with fire. This has led to significant eye sensitivity due to the smoke pollution. We found a large number of elderly individuals with advanced cataracts. With the help of the Kellerman Foundation and the Hope Alliance a new dental and eye building is in the planning stages. Once the building is completed the hope is to have eye surgeons come and perform cataract surgeries and train local doctors as well.

We were able to screen over 740 individuals in the five days of clinics. Four of the days were in extremely remote villages with an hour and half of travel over rough dirt roads. Over 660 pairs of glasses were dispensed, mostly reading glasses.

The people are remarkable in their closeness to nature and the basic needs of daily living. They were gracious and thankful for our efforts.

*It was quite humbling, and I return appreciative of my family and good health.*

I want the Making A Difference Foundation to know of my deep appreciation for their kind and generous support of my trip to help the people of Bwindi.

## RAYNA'S STORY

When I had my first child, Aaliyah, it was the greatest joy and love I've ever known. At almost 3 months old, I noticed something different about her. Naturally, I started researching and looking at medical journals for an answer. I brought my concerns to her pediatrician and was told not to "Google," as all first-time parents tend to overreact when they notice something that seems different about their child.

This wasn't good enough for me, so I pressed on and asked her to investigate.

A few weeks later my pediatrician called me, apologizing. Aaliyah was diagnosed with Systemic Macrocytosis (SM) - a rare and incurable disease. SM is a disorder that results in an excessive number of mast cells in your body, which build up in your skin, bones, or small intestines. After her diagnosis, I went to every specialist and provider I could find in South Florida that may have insight regarding this disease. Unfortunately, despite our best efforts, there was still no answer.

It was so difficult to watch Aaliyah's life become one that no child should have to endure - simply because of the way she looked. We were kicked out of play areas, asked to leave water parks, parents pulled their kids away from her in public, and we were even escorted off a plane.

When all was feeling hopeless, we miraculously stumbled upon a specialist in Washington DC, who was able to help us find some answers. Life finally began to level itself out for Aaliyah, and our family began to feel hopeful and wanted to share that hope with others.

Because of our personal experience, our family has been passionate about raising awareness and research for rare diseases - especially those affecting children. We got involved with the Children's Miracle Network (CMN), a nonprofit organization that raises funds for children's hospitals, medical research, and community awareness of children's health issues. We were able to take part in 'Dance Marathon', a fundraising event for the CMN. All funds were used to pay providers or buy equipment to be able to treat children's various conditions.

The Children's Miracle Network ignited my passion to give back because I felt I was able to give hope to families who had felt as hopeless as we did. Through our time volunteering, we have been able to meet families who have faced unimaginable hardships, and together find hope and joy. The grant from the Making a Difference Foundation helped to support a cause I'm passionate about and means the world to my family.

## MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN HEALTHCARE

Across the United States, many people face limited access to healthcare. This lack of access has far-reaching consequences not only to individuals and families, but to entire communities. Because sustainable change takes time and continued effort, the foundation is committed to supporting organizations who work every day to make a lasting impact.

From our beginning, the Making a Difference Foundation has partnered with two nonprofit organizations, the Junior League of Salt Lake and the Midvale CBC. Both of these organizations host annual health fairs that have allowed us to support access to healthcare to individuals and families right in our backyard. In 2019, we have added a partnership with the National Kidney Foundation in Oklahoma and are excited to see the long-term impact of this collaboration.

### Junior League of Salt Lake City, Utah

Every year the Junior League of Salt Lake organizes a two-day Community Assistance and Resource Event (CARE) Fair for families needing routine medical, dental and vision services. Typically, major barriers (i.e., time, language, finances, and transportation) prevent some Utah families from receiving many basic health and human services. The CARE Fair eliminates many of these barriers by bringing community resources together at one time in one place.



### Midvale Community Building Community Clinic, Utah

The Midvale CBC provides services that are targeted to improve the community and support individuals and families. They provide health services at a minimal cost including medical, dental, physical therapy, psychology, and counseling. The Community Center is a place for youth music lessons, parenting classes, family support, in-home pre-diabetes management, and oral health education for those who cannot afford those services.



### National Kidney Foundation, Oklahoma

The National Kidney Foundation is the leading organization in the U.S. dedicated to the awareness, prevention, and treatment of kidney disease for hundreds of thousands of healthcare professionals, millions of patients and their families, and tens of millions of Americans at risk.

# EMPLOYEE COMPASSION FUND

Difficult and sometimes tragic events – such as fighting a life-threatening illness, caring for a loved one, or dealing with the death of a family member – dramatically affects the employees of CHG each year. There is an incredible group of people at CHG who are always willing to help. While individual efforts help immensely, the Employee Compassion Fund was created to further support employees and provide much needed funds. Funded by employees, for employees, it provides tax-free financial grants to CHG employees who are facing financial hardship. To support the effort, the Making a Difference Foundation matches 50% of all employee donations to the Employee Compassion Fund.

## AMANDA'S STORY

I met my husband Josh in 2001. We didn't start dating right away, I made him chase me. I moved away for college and didn't expect him to wait for me. And even when I returned home, he had to work up to our first date. He claims all the chasing was worth it because he knew he loved me from the first moment we met.

Our love story quickly unfolded. Within the next three years, we got married, had our first daughter and our second followed a few years later. We even worked together at a wholesale plumbing business.

In 2018, I decided to make a career change and joined CompHealth (a CHG company) as a client developer. The weekend before I was to start my new job, Josh suffered a massive heart attack. Later, when he was admitted to the ICU, I learned that my 38-year-old husband had flatlined on our bedroom floor. Josh was in critical but stable condition. And just 72 hours after this health scare started, I had to be at new-hire training for my new job. I didn't want to draw attention to myself and the situation, but I knew I had to tell my leader.

*My family was facing uncertainty, but everyone around me was supportive and showed such genuine concern. I knew I wasn't alone.*

With all the growing medical expenses, there was a point we realized that we wouldn't be able to make our next mortgage payment. After a particularly tough day, I confided in a coworker. Jessica encouraged me to apply for an Employee Compassion Fund grant. She even helped me through the submission process. I received an approval within 24 hours. I rushed over to Jessica when I got the news and we both cried tears of joy!

Employees at CHG are passionate about taking care of their fellow coworkers. It is truly amazing that people I've never met were able to help my family through one of the most difficult times we have ever faced.

Josh's health is slowly improving. He is back to work and our life is settling into a new normal. I'm so grateful for everyone that donated to the ECF, and the ways they helped our family through this challenging time.
