



LOCAL GRANTS



Charese Jamison, DEI Manager at CHG Healthcare applied for a Local Grant from the Making a Difference Foundation to help fund Justice and Joy National Collaborative, a nonprofit she volunteers her time with. Justice and Joy sponsors a national advocacy network that offers mentoring and committee support to young moms from diverse backgrounds and helps them navigate the unique challenges they face. This group also helps meet the healthcare needs these women face but cannot afford. Finally, the network is committed to addressing policies and systems that prevent young moms from being able to support their children and achieve economic security. For Charese, this important work means a lot to her:

"It is an honor and privilege for me to work with an organization that has championed Justice and Joy for over 141 years. It started out with individuals who wanted to provide support for women living on the margins of society navigating challenges like poverty, unsheltered situations, and unplanned pregnancies. This organization's legacy collided with mine 30 years ago and allowed me to bring a child into this world with the help and support we needed."



INDIVIDUAL PROVIDER GRANTS



Angelique Dino, an ER Nurse, had the opportunity to travel to the Philippines with Health-e Charity this year on her first medical mission trip. With a grant from the foundation, she was able to work in a center that housed girls from 5-17 years old, most of whom had faced the trauma of abuse. At first the girls were timid and shy. The providers knew they should give the girls space to approach them when they felt safe and ready. Angelique shares, "The reason this part was memorable to me was because towards the end of the trip, we had really connected with the girls, and they had opened up. A lot of the girls said they looked up to me and wanted to be like me when they get older."

One of the reasons Angelique thinks the girls looked up to her is that she too is Filipino. She was able to meet their basic healthcare needs and give them hope. "Coming from a Filipino background, it really touched my heart to be able to show these girls they can have the future they work towards."



MEDICAL MISSION TRIP

"I had the privilege of joining the Making a Difference Foundation on a medical mission trip to Peru. I joined a team of 10 healthcare providers who spent 5 days working at pop-up clinics around the Cusco area. We were expecting to see 350 people in total, however, more than 800 people showed up to the clinics. It was humbling to arrive each morning to a long line of people waiting to be seen."

"I was so impressed with the providers that volunteered. They were eager to give their time and expertise to the communities we visited. They were dedicated to giving quality healthcare with the resources available, and they treated every patient with care and compassion."

"The providers put their hearts into the work and even skipped lunches to stay late at the clinic and make sure every person was seen. We all came together for the common good of these communities, and I felt like we made a big impact for those we visited."

"It was wonderful to participate in a Making a Difference Foundation medical mission trip, and it demonstrated that the work we do really does matter. We make a difference in the world."



SUSTAINABLE HEALTHCARE GRANTS



We've seen the dedication of physicians, nurses, translators, and volunteers as they care for the most vulnerable in our communities. From mental health programs to on-site pharmacies, our nonprofit partners address critical healthcare needs where they're most acute. Our Sustainable Healthcare Grants provide financial support to help in these efforts.

In Durham, North Carolina, Lincoln Community Health Center was able to continue funding its pharmacy program through our Sustainable Healthcare Grant. This means that residents in vulnerable communities won't lose access to the important medications they need. Through these grants, and with the help of our nonprofit partners, we're paving the way for a future where healthcare is within reach for all.

DISASTER RELIEF



In August of 2023, a series of devastating wildfires spread throughout Hawaii destroying thousands of homes, commercial buildings, and the beautiful communities of Maui. Over 100 people lost their lives, and countless others were left behind in the aftermath of the worst natural disaster in Hawaii's history.

By acting quickly, we identified local needs and funded grants to emergency response teams on the ground with food, water, shelter, and medical supplies. We made donations to the Hawaii Community Foundation, the Maui Food Bank, and the Maui Humane Society. And because CHG Healthcare has several clients throughout the Hawaiian Islands, the foundation also partnered with the Maui Health Foundation to support its employee assistance fund to help dozens of healthcare workers who experienced a complete loss of their homes.

We understand how important it is for our nonprofit partners to have the resources necessary to carry out this important work. As a foundation, we're committed to making a difference when it matters most. We're grateful to all emergency response teams for the relief they provide, and most importantly, the lives they impact.
